

SELECTION CRITERIA FOR SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS

The following recommendations for selection criteria are from both the Ohio School Resource Officers Association and the Department of Justice COPS Program, *A Guide to Developing, Maintaining, and Succeeding with your School Resource Officer Program.* The Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police has officially recognized and endorsed the criteria.

- 1. Likes and cares about children.
- 2. *Wants* to work in the school. Was not assigned the SRO position against his or her will.
- 3. Is flexible, patient, and even tempered.
- 4. Knows how to *defuse hostile situations* thru proper de-escalation techniques and calming techniques. Can speak quietly when needed, but also has command presence.
- 5. Has the *right demeanor and "people skills"*, including good writing and speaking communication skills.
- 6. Capable of *developing and maintaining a rapport* with administration, faculty, and staff.
- 7. Not a good position for badge heavy or ego-driven officers.
- 8. Is a good *role model* for students
- 9. Is knowledgeable about *juvenile laws and school law* (or willing to become knowledgeable)
- 10. *Has experience* as a patrol officer or road deputy.
- 11. Is able to work *independently* with little supervision.
- 12. Is exceptionally *dependable*.
- 13. Is willing to work very hard.
- 14. Is or can become an effective leader, presenter
- 15. Has high *integrity*
- 16. Will attend and complete the 40-hour SRO Basic Training through the Ohio School Resource Officers Association.
- 17. Demonstrates a consistently high standard of personal fitness and appearance.

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
